

MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING

The City Council of the City of Volga, SD met for a regular meeting Monday, May 3, 2021 at 5:32 PM at the Volga Community Center; Mayor Randy Santema presiding. Members present: Ken Fideler, Jody Havrevold, Nichole Hofer, Kelly VanderWal, Matt Jaquet, and Doug Wermedal. Also present: City Attorney Steve Britzman, City Administrator Jameson Berreth, Finance Officer Krista Larson, Fire Chief Jamie Russell, Gracie Nelson with the Volga Tribune, Joel Edman with Edman Development, Andrew Sloss CEO of BEDC, Allan Austreim, Clyde & Wayne Ulvestad, Lisa Rathbun, and Sioux Valley government students.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Wermedal made a motion to approve the consent agenda. Hofer seconded the motion. All in favor. Motion carried. The following items were on the consent agenda: Approval of May 3, 2021 Regular Meeting Agenda, Approval of April 19, 2021 Regular Meeting Minutes, and Resolution 2021-20 – Blending and Consumption – Ramirez.

RESOLUTION 2021-20 BE IT RESOLVED that in accordance with SDCL 35-1-5.5, prior authorization for persons to consume or blend alcoholic beverages on Saturday, May 8, 2021 at the Volga Auditorium is hereby given. All such consumption or blending shall occur during the party Ramirez. Said property shall be considered for purposes of the Resolution to be the location of a special license and shall not constitute a public place as defined by Ordinance 145 of the City of Volga. Sale of alcohol beverages shall not be permitted at any time at the above described location. There shall be no consumption of any alcoholic beverage by any individual who is under twenty-one years of age. Section 1.03.01 The Official Zoning Map adopted by

Ordinance 2015-01, April 6, 2015, as amended, of the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Volga be amended to classify the following properties: Lot 19A, Block 2, Original Plat to the City of Volga To “C-1” General Commercial with a “CB” Central Business Overlay from “R-2” Multiple Family Residential. VanderWal made a motion to approve Conditional Use Permit 2021-02 – Mobile Home Parks America, LLC. Hofer seconded the motion. Discussion was held. Berreth gave an overview of the LLC’s plans. Owner, Allan Austreim explained the intent to bring in 7 new homes and plans to improve the park going forward. The Council showed support for overall mobile park improvements. VanderWal made a motion to approve Variance Application 2021-01- Mobile Home Parks America, LLC. Hofer seconded the motion. Discussion was held. Berreth noted each met requirement and noted the variances needs. They include variance for Section 4.17.01 Part 3. reducing the lot width requirement from 50ft to 40ft; Part A. reducing the front yard requirement from 20ft to 12ft; and Part D. increasing maximum lot coverage from 25% to 33%. Waived requirements will be Part 8 - recreation area, 9 on-site storm shelter, and 10 on-site management. The Zoning Board recommended the approval of Variance Application 2021-01. VanderWal made a motion to approve RESOLUTION NO. 2021-22 RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE CREATION AND DESIGNATION OF CITY OF VOLGA TAX INCREMENT DISTRICT NUMBER SIX AND DEFINING ITS BOUNDARIES WHEREAS, the Volga Zoning Board has recommended the creation of Tax Increment District Number Six and has recommended the boundaries of the District as described herein; and WHEREAS, the City of Volga has the power, pursuant to SDCL §11-9-2(1), to create City of Volga Tax Increment District Number Six and to define its boundaries. THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED: 1. Authorization. The City hereby finds that twenty-five percent (25%) and more of the real property located within the boundaries of the proposed Tax Increment District Six, City of Volga, is a blighted area under SDCL §11-9-10(2), (4), (8) and 11-9-11. Further, the City finds that the improvement of the area is likely to enhance significantly the value of substantially all of the other real property in the District. The City also hereby exercises its powers pursuant to SDCL Chapter 9- 54 for the economic development of City of Volga Tax Incremental District Number Six. 2. Findings. The City Council makes the following findings: a. Not less than 25%

of the property in the District is a blighted area. b. Improvements to the District are likely to add thousands of dollars of assessed valuation to the District and will significantly and substantially enhance the value of all property in the District. c. There is a reasonable likelihood that there will be housing built in the District. d. The aggregate assessed value of the District plus the tax increment base of all other existing Districts in the City does not exceed ten percent of the total assessed valuation in the City. e. The District is open bare land void of site improvements, which impairs the sound growth of the City. f. The District lacks water connections, which substantially impairs the sound growth of the District. g. The District lacks sewerage connections or treatment, which substantially arrests the sound growth of the District. h. The District lacks streets, roads and fire protection which retards housing accommodations and constitutes an economic liability and is a detriment to the public welfare in its present condition. i. There is substantial need for housing in Volga, and the property proposed as Tax Increment District Number 6, with its open and undeveloped condition, and its obsolete platting, impairs and arrests the sound growth of the City. j. The District constitutes a blighted area as defined in SDCL Chapter 11-9. 3. Creation of District. There is hereby created, pursuant to SDCL Chapter 11-9, City of Volga Tax Increment District Number Six. 4. Date of Creation. The Tax Increment District is hereby created on May 3rd, 2021. 5. Boundaries of District. Tax Increment District Number Six shall have boundaries which shall include the following described real property: The South Five Hundred Feet (S 500') of the West Five Hundred Twenty-four Feet (W 524') of Lot "C" in the Northeast Quarter (NE¼) of Section Twenty-two (22), Township One Hundred Ten (110) North, Range Fifty-one (51) West of the 5th P.M., County of Brookings, State of South Dakota. Public Works

Wermedal made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2021-24 – Water Tower Bond Issuance. Jaquet seconded the motion. Discussion was held. Wermedal reiterated that the bond issuance was reworked after finding the need to request more financing for the project. Wermedal made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2021-25 – Water Tower Surcharge. VanderWal seconded the motion. Discussion was held. Wermedal noted the surcharge is not an

additional charge to residents but a portion of their current water bill. On roll call: VanderWal, Yes; Wermedal, Yes; Fideler, Yes; Havrevold, Yes; Hofer, Yes; Jaquet, Yes. Motion carried. Resolution will be printed separately and can be read in its entirety at City Hall by request.

Wermedal further explained the impact of time and inflation to the government students in attendance in relation to the water tower project costs. Wermedal also noted a citizens concern about the additional cost of the water tower painting. Further research by Banner Associates will be done to determine the cost above the included original painting price.

Berreth noted that the current water tower will be cleaned on May 19th and residents may experience changes in water pressure.

MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING

The City Council of the City of Volga, SD met for the annual meeting Monday, May 3, 2021 at 7:12 PM at the Volga Community Center; Mayor Randy Santema presiding. Members present: Ken Fideler, Jody Havrevold, Nichole Hofer, Kelly VanderWal, Matt Jaquet, and Doug Wermedal. Also present: City Attorney Steve Britzman, City Administrator Jameson Berreth, Finance Officer Krista Larson, Gracie Nelson with the Volga Tribune, and Lisa Rathbun.

Wermedal made a motion to approve the agenda. Fideler seconded the motion. On roll call: Havrevold, Yes; Hofer, Yes; Jaquet, Yes; VanderWal, Yes; Wermedal, Yes; Fideler, Yes; Motion carried.

City Attorney Britzman administered the oath of office for Mayor Santema, Council members VanderWal, and Wermedal, and Finance Officer Krista Larson.
